Faces of Trauma – The Art of Healing

Social and political unrest in the United States, wars around the globe and a worldwide pandemic have amplified an already growing concern around youth mental health. The U.S. Surgeon General, Vivek Murthy, MD, issued an advisory on youth mental health, calling it an “**urgent public health crisis**” that will require an all-hands-on deck effort to address.

The Children’s Center is stepping up to the mantle to lend a helping hand with the **8th Annual Faces of Trauma Event on May 25, 2022**, at the Museum of Contemporary Art Detroit (MOCAD) 4454 Woodward Ave, Detroit, MI 48201 from 5:00 to 7:30 p.m.

This year’s theme is **The Art of Healing**. Artist and performers including **The Mosaic Youth Theatre of Detroit** and **AleshaNicole** will perform and demonstrate how art can be used as a tool and resource to facilitate healing from traumatic life experiences and place participants on the “road to resilience.” There will be a keynote speaker sharing their story of resilience, activities, Youth Art from The Children’s Center on display, and light refreshments served.

This annual event is **free of charge and open to the public**, The Children’s Center clients, families, and staff. Faces of Trauma helps participants understand how trauma affects each person in different ways, and often when one member of a family experiences it; the whole family is affected. **Faces of Trauma is an event that explores the impact of trauma, and how individuals, families, and communities cope with it.**

Preregistration is required and this event is appropriate for adults and children 14+. All participants must provide proof of complete vaccination or a negative Covid test result taken at a maximum 72 hours prior to the event.
