Thank you for standing with us. Together, we're making a difference in so many lives.



Foster Care

Imagine this scenario... You're a nine-year-old living in a less than nurturing environment, feeling somewhat neglected. As a child, this is your reality, the world you know. Suddenly, Child Protective Services (CPS) shows up at your door and tells you that you have just five minutes to pack a bag because they are taking you to a new, safe home. If you were that child, what would you pack?

In Michigan, around 13,000 children are in foster care or residential placements due to neglect or abuse. Every day, CPS tirelessly works to place children in secure, caring, and stable homes. Although The Children's Center aims for family unification whenever possible, it's not always achievable.

Foster Care provides a temporary home for children who have experienced abuse or neglect, offering a safe and nurturing environment when their parents or relatives are unable to care for them.

The Child Welfare Team at the Children's Center remains dedicated to supporting children and families in need.



We are seeking dedicated and compassionate adults to offer a secure and nurturing home for children who have been removed from their families. Becoming a foster parent is a profound way to make a positive impact on a child's life. Each cleat represents a local nonprofit organization to uplift a cause that the artist is passionate about.

Trae IsAAc chose to leverage his art to make immense impact for children and families served by The Children's Center. Trae deeply values our mission in supporting the wellness and quality of youth and efforts to improve health and safety outcomes for future generations among our community.

During his mid-teens, Trae experienced the loss of his brother and mother to cancer. Art became



his refuge during this vulnerable time, enabling him to express his emotions and transform his trauma into triumph. Having walked a similar path to the children we serve, he empathizes with the children benefiting from the care and support our agency offers.

Trae thoughtfully chose to pay tribute to The Children's Center in his artwork, symbolizing three key elements: Driving, Carrying, and Scoring. In his depiction, Trae showcased children from various backgrounds engaging in the game of football, *driving* themselves towards a brighter future, *carrying* themselves through trial to triumph, and *scoring* through achieving happiness, peace of mind, and the confidence to pursue their dreams and goals.
