When Funding Falls Short, Our Commitment Grows Stronger

Recent federal funding reductions have led to significant changes in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits, leaving many families with far less support than before. Across Michigan, families served by The Children's Center are receiving notices from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), informing them of benefit cuts — in some cases, by as much as 50%.

"These reductions have had a profound impact on our families," says Laura LeFever, Director of Community Projects and Partnerships at



The Children's Center. "Many are already navigating financial instability, and these cuts have only deepened the struggle."

In response, The Children's Center is expanding its efforts through the Tau Beta Family Success Center, where families can access a small on-site pantry with essential items like food, hygiene products, and cleaning supplies. We're also connecting clients to a wider network of support — including mobile food distribution programs and partner agencies offering additional assistance.

But as need grows, so does the pressure on our resources. Food insecurity doesn't just affect the dinner table — it adds stress at home and can intensify emotional and behavioral challenges for the children we serve.

Big Fun, Big Impact

At The Children's Center, summer is a season of possibility — a time when our campus comes alive with laughter, learning, and meaningful connection. This year was no exception. Thanks to generous funding from the Tau Beta Association, our children experienced a summer full of opportunity, support, and joy — from exciting field trips and hands-on workshops to vibrant community celebrations.

A Summer Full of Adventures

Through our annual Summer Camp, children and teens explored new experiences and built lasting memories. Weekly outings included swimming lessons at Goldfish Swim School, fishing trips, a visit to the Detroit Zoo, card game competitions, and creative art projects that encouraged self-expression and teamwork. Additional activities brought even more summer fun with indoor tent-building and s'mores making, cooking and dance classes, as well as a Midtown museum scavenger hunt and bowling.



Beyond the fun and games, campers also gained valuable life skills. One special highlight was a financial literacy workshop led by Comerica Bank, where campers learned practical money skills and received books to take home — planting seeds of confidence and independence for the future.

Celebrating Wellness Together

On August 7, our campus transformed for the annual Health & Wellness Fair, welcoming families from across

the community. In partnership with DWIHN, Youth United, and Children Trust Michigan, we created a space where families could access vital health resources, connect with service providers, and enjoy a festive afternoon.

Kids enjoyed snow cones, a bounce house, crafting activities, and more — proving that wellness and fun go hand in hand. The event also offered essential health services: the WSU Mobile Health Unit and Walgreens provided physical exams; the Red Cross helped families sign up to receive smoke detectors; and Vision to Learn registered children for free eye exams and glasses. On August 14, 46 exams were conducted, and 26 children



qualified to receive a free pair of glasses — a clear step toward success in school and beyond.

Backpacks, Smiles, and a Fresh Start

To help families gear up for the school year, we hosted our Back to School Bazaar, where 2,000 brand-new backpacks filled with essential school supplies were distributed — thanks to the incredible generosity and support of Meijer and the Detroit Tigers Foundation.

Volunteers from all three organizations came together to sort supplies and prepare backpacks, ensuring each child walked away feeling confident and ready for the year ahead.



This summer was a powerful reminder of what's possible when children are given the chance to thrive. Thanks to our partners, volunteers, and supporters, we created moments of joy, learning, and care that will stay with our families long after the season ends.

Their hands-on involvement reflects not only a spirit of generosity, but a true commitment to the well-being



Legacy Builders

Some of the most powerful bonds aren't written in blood, but in shared purpose, laughter, and decades of unwavering service. That is the story of Penny, Simone, and Deb—three remarkable women whose steadfast support, friendship, and love for The Children's Center (TCC) have made them pillars of hope in our community.

In a recent heartfelt conversation, these longtime volunteers reflected on the journey that brought them together—and the impact they continue to make. Their connection to TCC began in the early 2000s. Each

woman arrived through different doors—friendship, breast cancer support groups, or simply the desire to give back after retirement. What began as occasional volunteering soon blossomed into a legacy of leadership, joy, and generosity.

From chairing holiday events to stepping in wherever needed, these women have done it all—quietly, faithfully, and with open hearts. Through both tears and laughter, Penny, Simone, and Deb shared how TCC became more than a nonprofit—it became a second home. Whether helping a child pick out a warm winter coat or comforting a grieving granddaughter through the bereavement program, they have witnessed the life-changing power of compassion. "TCC was there when my granddaughter lost her father," Deb recalled. "The support and counseling she received helped bring her back to life." For Simone, TCC was her anchor



through one of life's hardest storms. "When I lost my husband, they picked me up from the Center. Just being able to come back and still serve—it helps me keep going."

Beyond service, their years at TCC have brought lifelong friendships. They've traveled together, laughed together, and carried one another through seasons of joy and grief. And when asked what keeps them coming back, their answer was simple: the children.

"The need is so real," Deb said. "We may not have much, but if it means a child has a gift for Christmas, then it's worth it." Their commitment goes far beyond holidays and special events. Each of these women has given financially when they could, volunteered faithfully for more than 20 years, and raised the standard for what true community service looks like.

So, what do they hope younger generations will take away from their legacy? Their response was as unified as their friendship: "Don't be selfish. Think of others. Believe in something greater than yourself." We've lovingly given these women the title of Legacy Builders. To them, it means being part of something lasting, humble, and impactful. To us, it means they've laid a foundation of hope—and others are now following in their footsteps.

If you ask them to describe TCC in one word, they answer together, without hesitation: "Family." To the families we serve, the children we uplift, and the community we fight for—Penny, Simone, and Deb are the unsung heroes. They are the smiling faces behind the scenes, the steady hands that lift others up, and truly, the heartbeat of hope.
