Meet the Harland Family

A family shattered by addiction, and children left to face a silence they never asked for.

The Harland children experienced the unimaginable when they lost the one person who anchored their world despite his struggles: their father, who died suddenly from a drug overdose.

Their mother, battling substance use herself, was unable to care for them—leaving the five young children without either parent, without answers, and without a safe place to call home. The pain and confusion addiction brings

What followed was a long journey. The grandparents had to navigate the loss of their own son while taking on the full-time care of five grieving children. It was overwhelming. Emotional. Messy. And hard. But the Harland Family wasn't alone.

Because of you, The Children's Center was able to hear them, see them, and stand beside them.

For more than two years, our dedicated Child Welfare specialist, Anita, walked every step of the journey with them.

She was patient when life felt chaotic. Persistent when things got hard. And fully present through it all—every court delay, every counseling session, every tearful milestone.

Then, one day, after years of waiting, worrying, and holding on with hope, the adoption was finalized.
