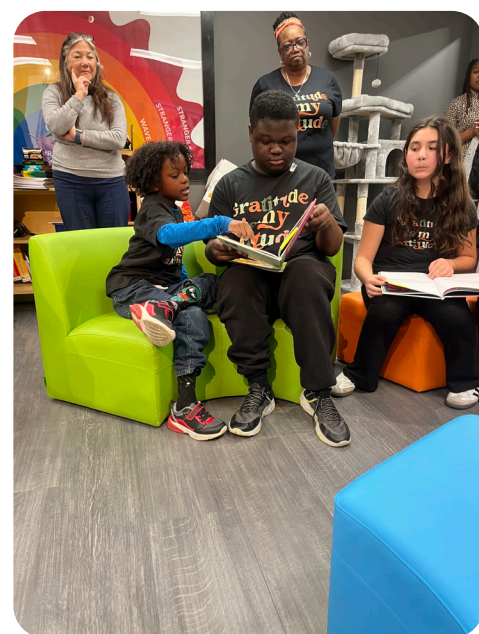


Little Readers, Big Hearts

Meals that Matter

This Thanksgiving, we were reminded of the extraordinary strength and generosity of our community. Thanks to the support of our partners and neighbors, more than 500 individuals enjoyed a warm and memorable holiday meal through our annual Turkey and Ham Giveaway and a special home-cooked meal donation from Norm's Diner.

Our longtime partners at Tau Beta played a pivotal role once again, providing 50 turkeys and 50 hams—complete with all the traditional sides—as well as dedicated volunteer support to help distribute meals to families. Their commitment ensured that dozens of households could celebrate the holiday with comfort and abundance.

Meanwhile, Norm's Diner, a locally owned restaurant in Detroit's West Village, responded with incredible compassion to the recent SNAP benefit pause. Motivated to make a difference, they launched a community-driven effort that resulted in fresh, home-cooked Thanksgiving meals for 400 individuals. In an extraordinary act of generosity, they also presented The Children's Center with a \$17,500 donation to strengthen essential programs, including our pantry.



As we reflect on this heartwarming season of giving, we are deeply moved by the spirit of unity, compassion, and gratitude displayed by our community. Whether in moments of challenge or celebration, our partners continue to stand beside us, helping to create brighter, more hopeful futures for every child and family we serve. We are truly thankful for a community that cares.

Voices of the Future

Following the launch of our endowment through the Michigan Central Station Children's Endowment Initiative (MCSCEI), we have seen our community rally in remarkable ways to support the future of our city's children and families. This initiative has been championed by Detroit youth themselves, and it has been inspiring to witness young leaders across the city stepping forward to raise funds and help move us toward our goal of securing \$1.5 million by December 2026.

One standout example is high school junior Alaina Peters, who chose The Children's Center as the focus of her DECA Community Giving Project. Alaina immersed herself fully—researching our mission, volunteering her time, and spreading awareness through a thoughtful and compelling display of our work. She also launched a successful crowdfunding campaign that raised \$1,279, every dollar of which is doubled through the endowment's matching opportunity.

Alaina's passion, determination, and creativity exemplify the powerful role young people can play in strengthening their communities and driving meaningful change. Her classmates joined her efforts as well, contributing to the campaign and proudly wearing branded bracelets to help promote The Children's Center.

We are deeply grateful for the dedication of our community members—especially the youth who are leading the way. Their efforts are creating a lasting legacy, and we look forward to watching this next generation continue to uplift and inspire our city.

A Year of Resilience

As we ring in the New Year, we want to celebrate the incredible progress of one of our clients. At 17, she faced profound challenges—grieving the loss of her father to suicide, struggling with major depressive disorder, and navigating frequent suspensions at school. She had fallen into a difficult peer group and often clashed with her own family.

Over the past year, working closely with her General Behavioral Health clinician, Sashay, she has made remarkable strides. Through consistent support and guidance, she learned to identify her feelings, practice problem-solving, and manage her emotions. These skills helped her rebuild trust and strengthen relationships with her family.

Today, she is no longer at risk of expulsion, has applied to colleges, and is focused on achieving her dream of higher education. Her journey over the past year is a powerful reminder of the resilience and transformation that is possible with support, self-reflection, and determination.

This progress wouldn't have been possible without the generosity of donors like you. Your support helps provide the guidance, tools, and care that make stories like hers possible. Thank you for investing in hope, healing, and brighter futures.

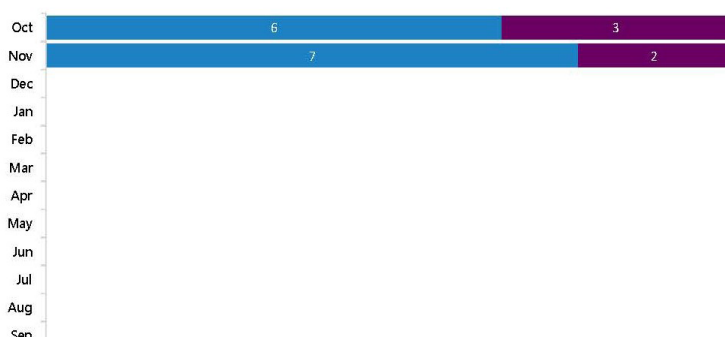

This December, 360 families with 1,409 children were able to shop for gifts at no cost. Because of you, nearly 1,500 children experienced the excitement and comfort of the holidays. 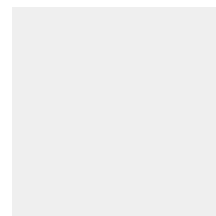
